— COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS —

- Played in 52 career games (40 starts) throughout his collegiate career at Indiana (2024-25), James Madison (2023) and St. Francis (PA) (2022)... Earned All-Conference honors each of his four collegiate seasons, including second-team All-Big Ten (2025), third-team All-Big Ten (2024), first-team All-Sun Belt (2023) and first-team All-Northeast (2022)
- Recorded 242 receptions for 3,678 yards (15.2 avg.) and 44 TDs throughout his four-year collegiate career
- Finished second in Indiana single-season school history with 15 receiving TDs in 2025 (James Hardy, 16 in 2007)
- Despite only playing two seasons at Indiana, his 23 TD receptions ranked third in school history after his final season (2025)
- Recorded at least 1 reception in 51 of 52 career games played
- Recorded 13 career 100-yard receiving games (six at Indiana, six at JMU and one at SFU)

— PERSONAL —

- Oldest brother, Jalen, played WR at Division II Virginia State (2016) and older brother, Josh, played safety at VMI (2019-20) and James Madison (2021-23)... Elijah and Josh played together for one season (2023) at JMU under head coach Curt Cignetti
- Transferred to Indiana in 2024, following Coach Cignetti, where the two would help lead the Hoosiers to the program's first-ever National Championship in 2025
- Caught passes at Indiana (2025) from QB Fernando Mendoza, who was selected with the first- overall pick in the 2026 NFL Draft by the Las Vegas Raiders
- Nickname is "Waffle House," given to him by his father during his sophomore year at James Madison, because he is "always open"
- Is expected to graduate from IU in June 2026 with a degree in liberal arts

- Last name is pronounced: suh-RAT

2025: (INDIANA – 14/13)

- Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors after playing in 14 games (13 starts) for Indiana, recording 65 receptions for 830 yards (12.8 avg.) and a career-best 15 receiving TDs, good for second in single-season school history (James Hardy, 16 in 2007)
- Had 3 catches for 28 yards and helped Indiana finish an undefeated season (16-0) en route to winning their first-ever National Championship after defeating Miami, 27-21 (1/20/26)
- Recorded 7 receptions for 75 yards and 2 TDs in the CFP victory over Oregon (1/9/26), becoming just the second Hoosier in school history to record multiple receiving TDs in a postseason game (Thomas Lewis – 1993)
- Had 8 catches for 121 yards and 1 TD in the victory at Oregon (10/11)
- Posted 156 receiving yards on 7 catches, adding 1 TD at Iowa (9/27)
- Had a season-high (tied) 9 receptions for 92 yards and 2 TDs vs. Illinois (9/20)
- Produced 9 receptions for 97 yards and a career-high 3 TDs vs. Kennesaw State (9/6)

2024: (INDIANA – 13/13)

- Received third-team All-Big Ten accolades after starting all 13 games as a junior, recording 53 receptions for 957 yards (18.1 avg.) and 8 TDs... Had four 100-yard receiving games in his first season with the Hoosiers
- Recorded 4 receptions for 67 yards, caught a 2-point conversion and recovered an onside kick at Notre Dame (12/20)
- Had a season-high 8 catches for a career-high 165 yards and 2 TDs (including a long of 84 yards) vs. Purdue (11/30)
- Posted 4 catches for 59 yards and 2 TDs (his first multi-TD game as a Hoosier) at Michigan State (11/2)
- Recorded 7 receptions for 135 yards at Northwestern (10/5)
- Had 7 receptions for 128 yards and 1 TD vs. Maryland (9/28)

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- Posted 6 catches for 137 yards and scored his first TD with Indiana vs. Western Illinois (9/6)
- Made his Indiana debut in the season opener against FIU (8/31), recording 2 catches for 12 yards

2023: (JAMES MADISON – 13/10)

- Earned first-team All-Sun Belt honors after appearing in all 13 games (10 starts) in his lone season with the Dukes...Recorded single-season career highs in receptions (83) and receiving yards (1,191), adding 8 TDs on the season...His 1,191 receiving yards ranked 11th nationally
- Caught at least 2 receptions in all 13 games and had six 100-yard receiving outputs
- Recorded 6 catches for 107 yards and a career-high 3 TDs at Coastal Carolina (11/25)
- Had a career-high 13 catches for 160 yards against UConn (11/11)
- Posted 8 receptions for 139 yards and 1 TD against Old Dominion (10/28)
- Made his JMU debut against Bucknell, recording 2 catches for 29 yards (9/2)

2022: (ST. FRANCIS [PA.] – 12/4)

- Earned first-team All-Northeast Conference and Freshman All-America honors after appearing in 12 games (four starts) at St. Francis (PA)...Recorded 42 receptions for 700 yards (16.7 avg.) and 13 TDs

- Recorded 5 receptions for 77 yards and 2 TDs in the NEC Championship game against Merrimack (11/19)

- Had 7 catches for 121 yards and tied St. Francis' single-game record with 3 receiving TDs at Sacred Heart (10/29)

— HIGH SCHOOL —

- Transferred to St. Frances (Baltimore) Academy midway through his junior year (Jan. 2020), then played an extra year of eligibility in 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic cancelling the 2020 season
- Prepped at Colonial Forge (Stafford, VA) HS from 2017-19, where he was a three-year letterwinner and played WR, DB and was a kickoff returner
- Helped the program to an 11-1 record and appearance in the 2018 regional championship as a sophomore
- Earned All-State honors as a DB his junior year
- Garnered All-District and All-Region recognition as a WR and returner as a junior
- Also lettered in basketball at Colonial Forge
- Was originally a no-star recruit and was unranked by *247Sports* for the 2022 class
