— KEY TRANSACTIONS —

- Josh Cuevas was selected by the Ravens in the fifth round (173rd overall) of the 2026 NFL Draft... Was the second of three Ravens draft picks in the round (CB Chandler Rivers & RB Adam Randall)

— COLLEGE HONORS —

- Selected to the Mackey Award Watch List, presented each year to the nation's top tight end (2025)
- Named to the Hispanic College Football Player of the Year Watch List (2025)
- Third-team All-Big Sky at Cal Poly (2022)

— COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS —

- Spent his final two collegiate years (2024-25) at Alabama, playing in 25 games at TE... Totaled 53 receptions for 629 yards and 5 TDs over two seasons with the Crimson Tide
- Played in 12 games (11 starts), catching 37 passes for 411 yards and 4 TDs in 2025 for the Crimson Tide... Missed Alabama's final two regular season games and the SEC Championship vs. Georgia due to injury
- Appeared in 13 games, totaling 16 receptions for 218 yards and 1 TDs, while adding a key role in the rotation at tight end at Alabama (2024)... Notable performances included a TD against Georgia, 3 receptions for 54 yards against Wisconsin and a 31-yard TD in the bowl game against Michigan
- At Washington (2023), played in all 15 games at TE during his lone season with the Huskies, registering 4 receptions for 164 yards and a TD, while also playing special teams... Named the Huskies coaches' Special Teams Player of the Week following the win at No. 10 Oregon State
- While at Cal Poly in 2022, earned third-team All-Big Sky honors after catching 50 passes for 563 yards and 5 TDs... Posted at least 5 catches in six games

- Graduated from Alabama (2025) with a bachelor's degree in human environmental science
- Was a three-sport athlete, also participating in baseball and basketball at Campbell Hall HS
- Lists scientific research, video games and traveling as hobbies

2025: (ALABAMA – 12/11)

- Appeared in 12 games (11 starts) as a senior, taking over the lead TE role, but missed the Tide's final two regular season games and the SEC Championship vs. Georgia due to injury
- Recorded 37 catches for 411 yards and 4 TDs, also adding a 7-yard rush and 1 tackle on the season
- Selected to the Mackey Award Watch List, presented each year to the nation's top TE
- Named to the Hispanic College Football Player of the Year Watch List
- Caught 4 passes for 35 yards in the CFP quarterfinal (Rose Bowl) vs. Indiana
- Earned offensive (power) player of the week recognition from the Alabama coaching staff for his play against Wisconsin (9/13) and at Oklahoma (12/19) in the CFP
- Also named an offensive (skill) player of the week following the South Carolina (10/25) and LSU (11/8) matchups
- Played a key role in the Tide's victory over South Carolina (10/25), catching 3 passes for 16 yards and a TD... Also added a 2-point conversion late in the fourth quarter to tie the game

2024: (ALABAMA – 13/0)

- In his first year with the Crimson Tide, appeared in all 13 games on offense and special teams, totaling 218 yards and 1 TD on 16 receptions... Also recorded 3 tackles on special teams
- Recorded 3 catches for 31 yards in the Iron Bowl vs. Auburn (11/30)
- Caught 1 pass for a 37-yard TD against Wisconsin (9/14), also making 1 tackle on special teams

2023: (WASHINGTON – 15/0)

- Saw action in all 15 games during his lone season with the Huskies, playing both at TE and on special teams... Huskies competed in the National Championship game against Michigan
- Totaled 164 yards and a TD on 4 receptions
- Named the Huskies coaches' Special Teams Player of the Week following the win at No. 10 Oregon State
- Was a teammate of current Ravens T Roger Rosengarten
- Won the Tyee Sports Council Community Service Award at the team's postseason banquet

2022: (CAL POLY – 11/11)

- Earned third-team All-Big Sky recognition as a redshirt freshman
- Finished second on the team with 57 receptions totaling 622 yards and 6 TDs during his All-Conference season

2021: (CAL POLY – 3/0)

- Began his collegiate career at Cal Poly
- Saw time in three games during the 2021 campaign, redshirting at season's end
- Caught 4 passes for 56 yards during his first season

— HIGH SCHOOL —

- Was a two-way player at Campbell Hall (North Hollywood, CA) HS at WR and OLB
- Earned All-Gold Coast League honors during his senior year (2020)
- Named Campbell Hall's Offensive Most Valuable Player as a junior in 2019, recording 55 catches for 700 yards and 11 TDs...Also contributed 62 tackles, including 10 TFL
- Tallied 380 yards and 10 TDs on 31 receptions as a sophomore to earn All-League second-team accolades
